Thanks to you, our mentor volunteers, Americorp VISTAs and donors, Friends in Action has been able to help many low-income families in Jefferson and Berkeley counties make significant progress toward self-sufficiency and a better life for themselves and their children. VISTA members focus on building the capacity of community based programs, services and systems that help families living in poverty improve their lives for the long term. We are grateful to the AmeriCorps Program and our VISTA volunteers for their service and support of the Friends in Action program.

# **Adopt a Family to Help Fight Poverty in Our Community**

You can help Friends in Action reduce poverty in the Eastern Panhandle one family at a time by becoming a Friends in Action's Adopt A Family sponsor.
